



Sedation Regulations Snapshot

- Colorado – 16 hrs of didactic instruction, **permit required** (OPA&NPA, AED), under 12 yo needs pedo designation (pedo residency, mod permit or 30hrs & 10 cases)
- Florida - No minimal oral sedation permit (oral up to MRD + N2O is ok), AED
- Georgia – No minimal oral sedation permit required (oral +N2O is ok, supplemental dosing ok up to 1.5xMRD, ≥13 yo)
- Indiana – no permit required for minimal or moderate oral sedation
- Massachusetts – **Permit B-2 required** (16hrs + 3 pt experiences)
- Michigan – No minimal sedation permit required (enteral course according to the 2012 ADA Guidelines)
- Mississippi – No permit required for “Combination Inhalation Enteral Anxiolysis”. AED. Permit required for Enteral Conscious Sedation requires 22 hrs + 15 clinically oriented experiences, ACLS (OCS on pts <13yo and special needs patients require additional training)
- Nebraska - – **Minimal sedation permit required**, 16 hrs.
- New Jersey – No permit required for minimal sedation/anxiolysis. (Enteral sedation permit requires 40 hrs of board-approved University training)
- New York – No minimal sedation permit required (enteral moderate sedation requires 60 hrs & 10 live cases)
- North Carolina – anxiolysis: single dose of a minor psychosedative, possibly in combination with nitrous oxide does not require a permit. **Minimal sedation: permit req’d**, 18 hrs, MRD, ACLS, exam and facility inspection
- Oklahoma – No permit required for adult minimal or moderate oral sedation, only one sedated patient at a time, pulse oximeter required
- Pennsylvania – No minimal sedation permit required, N2O permit required.
- Tennessee – No minimal sedation permit required, anxiolysis (single oral drug up the MRD + N2O ok, staff must have BLS/CPR, oral meds > 13yo), Limited Conscious Sedation permit (aka, OCS) requires 24 hrs + 10 clinically oriented experiences, ACLS, Facility inspection
- Utah - 16 hrs + clinically oriented experiences for minimal oral sedation, BLS, **Class II permit required**
- Virginia – No minimal sedation permit required (<13 all medication administered in the office, pulse oximeter req’d)
- Washington - 14-21 hrs for minimal oral sedation, BLS, no permit required. Moderate oral sedation requires 28 hrs total, BLS, and a permit.
